What information do students need?





- ★ Student's skills and interests (not yours!)
- ★ Programs that match those skills & interests
- ★ High school course requirements and grades necessary to apply for the programs
- ★ Institutions that offer the programs
- ★ Location of institution (does it fit the student- visit, check things out, stay at home or live in residence?)
- ★ Consider cost of program, travel, textbooks and other supplies



How can parents help?

★ It is important to support your student in the process, but not do the process for them.



- ★ It is their future the student needs to take ownership
- ★ Post-secondary institutions consider students to be young adults; they talk to the student not the parent
- ★ Some students take longer to figure it out!








Credits and grad lists:

The school counsellors will check student's graduation status, but it remains the **responsibility** of students and parents to ensure that all graduation requirements are met.

Potential Grad List



- Posted in early October and at the end of February (S2).
- Shows students what we have on record as their full legal name in order to prepare graduation diplomas (It must be the correct full legal name).

June 2026 Grad List

 A list will be posted the day before graduation in June listing the graduates based on their completion S2 courses.



Graduation Requirements:



Information Item CREDITS FOR GRADUATION DIPLOMA

These requirements apply to any student earning the Nova Scotia High School Graduation Diploma.

Students require a prinimum of 18 credits to graduate. No more than seven of the 18 credits may be for grade 10 courses, and at least five must be for grade 12 courses.

The following are compulsory credits for graduation:

Language, Communication, and Expression

- 3 language arts, one at each grade level
- 1 arts: dance, drama, music, or visual arts

Science, Mathematics, and Technology

- * 3 mathematics (one credit at each grade level)
- 2 science: one from Science 10, biology, chemistry, or physics, and one other approved science course
- 1 other from science or technology: eligible courses can be found in the Public School Programs (PSP) within the categories of Sciences; Skilled Trades; Technology Education; and Technology Integration and ICT Courses.

Personal Development and Society

- 1 physical education: eligible credits include Physical Education 10, Physical Education 11, Dance 11, Fitness Leadership 11, Physically Active Living 11, Yoga 11, Physical Education 12, and Physical Education Leadership 12
- 1 Canadian history: African Canadian Studies 11; Canadian History 11; Gaelic Studies 11; Études acadiennes 11 and Mi'kmaw Studies 11
- 1 global studies: Global Geography 12, Advanced Global Geography 12, Global History 12, Advanced Global History 12, Global Politics 12, and Advanced Global Politics 12

Within the 18 course requirements for a graduation diploma, in most cases, no student may receive credit for two courses in the same specific subject area at the same grade level. There are a few exceptions: these include Co-op courses and Language Arts with a Canadian Literature course.

NS universities tend to visit each high school and most have open houses. NSCC also has open houses.





Transcripts

- ★ Most post-secondary institutions (11) in Nova Scotia are now part of the MyTranscripts system through the MyNSFuture gateway.
 - For these post-secondary institutions in Nova Scotia, students do not need to send transcripts, instead they provide their 10-digit student identification number on the post-secondary application.
- ★ If applying outside of Nova Scotia, students must place an order through the <u>Auburn Drive High School website</u>. Students are responsible for mailing transcripts to the post-secondary institutions. Upon request, electronic transcripts can often be sent directly to the post-secondary institution
- ★ June 2026
 - In the graduation package there will be two sealed final transcripts, one of which must be sent to the post-secondary institution the student will attend in the fall (not necessary if the institution is using the MyTranscripts system).

Decided on a school for September 2026? Follow up is required!

- ★ In all cases final marks must be sent to the post-secondary institution following graduation in June 2026.
 - EXCEPT if the institution is using the MyTranscripts system then the institution will be able access the final transcript using the 10-digit student identification number
- * It is the student's responsibility to deliver the final transcript to the institution.
- ★ For post-secondary programs, students often pick actual courses and schedules in the spring or summer through the institution's online systems.
 - Highly recommend connecting with academic advisors at the institutions!





Research

- ★ Lots of scholarships out there but often takes time and effort by student!
- ★ Also monetary awards/bursaries based on financial need, leadership, volunteerism and industry specific awards.

★ JUNE 2026: Students who receive a scholarship letter at the graduation ceremony must bring the letter, as well as proof of post-secondary enrolment, to Ms. Saunders in September 2026.

> The money will be forwarded directly to the institution.
